JOB SUMMARY Under the general supervision of a supervisor, repairs and services electronic security and mechanical systems and performs a variety of skilled, journeyman level building construction, alteration, and maintenance repair work. MAJOR DUTIES (Any one position may not include all of the duties listed, nor do the listed examples include all duties which may be found in positions of this class.) Responsible for servicing and maintenance of electronic security and mechanical systems in the Weber County Correctional Facility. Will develop, service and maintain a preventative maintenance schedule for the electronic security systems. Repairs and services air conditioning systems and performs a variety of skilled journeyman level electrical, mechanical maintenance, painting, carpentry, plastering, masonry, plumbing, metal, and other related work. Installs or repairs wiring systems, light fixtures, outlets, bulbs, and fuses, and performs other electrical work. Installs, maintains, and/or repairs pneumatic controls, heating and refrigeration systems, boilers, appliances, locks, and related mechanical devices. May serve as a lead worker over two (2) or more Building Service Workers if assigned; outlines tasks to be accomplished and materials, supplies, and parts required. Performs cabinetmaking and other specialized carpentry construction work; hangs doors, lays flooring, installs partitions and drop ceilings, repairs door closures, and performs other carpentry work. Repairs faucets, unstops clogged lines, cuts and repairs pipes, and performs other plumbing and steam fitting work. Paints and redecorates walls, woodwork, furniture, and fixtures. Welds, brazes, solders, and cuts material using oxy-acetylene and electric welding equipment to repair existing structures or to construct new facilities. Reads, interprets, and works from sketches, diagrams, and blueprints; maintains an inventory of commonly used materials, supplies, and parts. Performs related work as assigned.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS Completion of an associate degree in electronics or associated field or two (2) year advanced electronics training at accredited training institution. AND Five years of diversified experience in advanced electronics or building maintenance activities. Preference will be given to verifiable training or experience, at the associate or journeyman level. OR An equivalent combination of education and experience.

Considerable knowledge of the standard methods, practices, tools and materials used in a variety of building maintenance functions; considerable knowledge of the hazards and safety precautions common to building maintenance. Skill in the use of specialized and common tools and materials of several trades. Ability to read, interpret, and work from sketches, diagrams, and blueprints; ability to make cost estimates of time and materials; ability to prepare and maintain routine records; ability to communicate effectively orally and in writing; ability to lead and organize the work of others; ability to perform moderately strenuous manual labor for extended periods of time; ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with employees, other departments, and the general public.

SPECIAL QUALIFICATIONS Must possess a state license as a skilled journeyman in one of the major building trades. Must possess or be able to possess a valid Utah drivers's license. May be on call 24 hours a day; must have a telephone. Must be adaptable to changing work hours as shift hours may be changed. May be required for evening, holiday, or weekend emergencies.

TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT USED Motorized vehicles and equipment, including dump truck, pickup truck, utility truck, street sweeper, jetter/inductor truck, manlift, tamper, plate compactor, saws, pumps, compressors, sanders, generators, common hand and power tools, shovels, wrenches, detection devices, mobile radio, phone, ditch witch.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job.

Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions. While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly required to use hands to finger, handle, feel or operate objects, tools, or controls and reach with hands and arms. The employee frequently is required to stand and talk or hear. The employee is occasionally required to walk; sit; climb or balance; stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl. The employee must frequently lift and/or move up to 25 pounds and occasionally lift and/or move up to 100 pounds. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision, color vision, peripheral vision, depth perception, and the ability to adjust focus.

WORK ENVIRONMENT The work environment characteristics described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions. The employee frequently works near moving mechanical parts and is frequently exposed to wet and/or humid conditions and vibration. The employee occasionally works in high, precarious places and is occasionally exposed to fumes or airborne particles, toxic or caustic chemicals, and risk of electrical shock. The noise level in the work environment is usually loud.
