JOB SUMMARY Under the general supervision of the Lead Equipment Mechanic, performs a wide variety of skilled and technical maintenance and repair work on automotive and a wide variety of light, medium, and heavy equipment.

MAJOR DUTIES (Any one position may not include all of the duties listed, nor do the listed examples include all duties which may be found in positions of this class.)

Performs major and minor tune-ups on automotive and other mechanical equipment using appropriate test equipment. Performs major and minor maintenance and repair work on gasoline and diesel engines, manual transmissions, differentials, and other units. Performs major and minor mechanical work on suspensions and chassis systems, cooling, fuel, electrical, and hydraulic systems. Operates welding equipment to repair broken parts from automotive and other mechanized equipment.

Responds to telephone and/or radio requests for emergency mechanical repair of department equipment in the field. Tests maintenance and repair work to ensure satisfactory results; maintains necessary records and forms on work performed. Performs related work as required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS Required education, training, and experience: High school graduation AND three years of experience as a mechanic or any equivalent combination of education and experience. Working knowledge of automotive mechanics; Considerable knowledge of gas and diesel engines, transmissions, hydraulics, fire pumps and valves, generators, and welding; price trends and grades or quality of materials and equipment; Working knowledge of the hazards and safety precautions common to municipal maintenance and repair activities; Working knowledge of the practices, methods, materials and tools used in modern equipment maintenance. Skill in the use of tools, materials, and test equipment. Ability to diagnose mechanical and electrical defects and determine steps necessary to put equipment in proper operating condition; ability to ensure compliance with and follow standard safety practices and procedures common to equipment maintenance work; ability to communicate effectively verbally and in writing; ability to keep accurate and complete records; ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with employees and the general public.

SPECIAL QUALIFICATIONS Must possess or be able to possess a valid Utah Driver's license and have a good driving record; must be on call 24 hours per day.

Applicants who are selected for employment with Weber County will be required to submit an up-to-date copy of their Motor Vehicle Record from the Utah State License Division prior to starting work.

TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT USED Motorized vehicles for mechanical testing purposes, power and hand tools and equipment for vehicle and mechanical system work; mechanic's tools including jacks, hydraulic lifts, air tools, and other tools required for minor repairs and routine maintenance of motorized vehicles; electronic vehicle diagnostic equipment; personal computer, calculator, phone; mobile or portable radio.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions. While performing the duties of this job, the employee is frequently required to use hands to finger, handle, feel or operate objects, tools, or controls; and reach with hands and arms. The employee is occasionally required to climb or balance; stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl.

The employee is occasionally required to walk, sit and talk or hear. The employee must frequently lift and/or move up to 25 pounds, and occasionally lift weights up to 100 pounds. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, color vision, and the ability to adjust focus.

WORK ENVIRONMENT

The work environment characteristics described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions. While performing the duties of this job, the employee frequently works near moving mechanical parts or in outside weather conditions. The employee is occasionally exposed to wet and/or humid conditions, fumes, toxic or caustic chemicals. The noise level in the work environment is moderately noisy.
