JOB SUMMARY Under the close supervision of a Heavy Equipment Crew Leader, performs a variety of semi-skilled and skilled work in the operation of medium equipment, machinery, and tools used in construction, maintenance, repair, and snow removal activities.

MAJOR DUTIES (Any one position may not include all of the duties listed, nor do the listed examples include all duties which may be found in positions of this class.) Acts as a lead worker over Equipment Operator I's; assigns work. Operates ten-wheel dump trucks, pup trailers, semi-trailer and transport, rubber tired front-end loader, backhoe, and roller in construction, maintenance, repair, and snow removal operations. Operates all equipment assigned to the Equipment Operator I Class as required. Checks and services assigned equipment; performs routine maintenance and emergency repairs; reports mechanical problems for shop repairs. Operates heavier equipment on a limited training basis as assigned. Trains less experienced personnel in the care and operation of assigned equipment. Performs required manual labor involved in crew construction and maintenance projects such as loading and unloading trucks, cutting trees, and brush, repairing fences and culverts, installing and painting traffic signs, guard rails, bridges and patching. Performs related work as required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS Required education, training, and experience: Completion of high school or equivalent, AND Two years of equipment operation or road work experience OR

Any equivalent combination of education and experience. Required knowledge, skills, and abilities: A working knowledge of road work and drainage operations and requirements; working knowledge of safety operations. Skill in the operation of listed tools and equipment. Ability to operate assigned equipment under varying conditions; ability to perform minor equipment maintenance and repair; ability to learn and follow standard safety practices and procedures common to equipment operation work; ability to follow written and verbal instructions; ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with employees and the general public.

SPECIAL QUALIFICATIONS Must currently possess, or be able to obtain, a valid Utah CDL license within 60 days of date of hire and have a good driving record. Applicants who are selected for employment with Weber County will be required to submit an up-to-date copy of their Motor Vehicle Record from the Utah State License Division prior to starting work. May be subject to 24-hour call depending on weather conditions or emergencies. May be required to have access to an operating telephone or equivalent method of contact in case of emergency, may be required periodically to perform higher or lower level duties. Incumbent must live sufficiently close to the maintenance station so they can respond to an emergency within a reasonable period of time. Preference will be given to applicants living in, or willing to relocate to, Weber County.

TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT USED

Motorized vehicles and equipment, including ten wheel dump trucks, utility truck, back-hoe, front-end loader, common hand and power tools, shovels, wrenches detection devices, mobile and portable radio, phone.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly required to use hands to finger, handle, or feel objects, tools, or controls and reach with hands and arms. The employee frequently is required to stand and talk or hear. The employee is occasionally required to walk; sit; climb or balance; stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl; and taste or smell.

The employee must frequently lift and/or move up to 50 pounds and occasionally lift and/or move up to 100 pounds. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision, color vision, peripheral vision, depth perception, and the ability to adjust focus.

**WORK ENVIRONMENT**

The work environment characteristics described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions. While performing the duties of this job, the employee regularly works in outside weather conditions. The employee frequently works near moving mechanical parts and is frequently exposed to wet and/or humid conditions and vibration. The employee occasionally works in high, precarious places and is occasionally exposed to fumes or airborne particles, toxic or caustic chemicals, and risk of electrical shock. The noise level in the work environment is usually loud. Ninety percent of the work is performed out of doors.
