UDOT Seeks Public Input on I-15 Corridor Plan, Kaysville to Ogden

The Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT), in conjunction with the Utah Transit Authority (UTA) and Wasatch Front Regional Council (WFRC), are conducting a corridor planning study for I-15 between 200 North in Kaysville and 31st Street in Ogden and from the Great Salt Lake on the west to US89 on the east. The purpose of this project is to develop, evaluate, and recommend transportation improvements throughout the study area. The public is invited to review and comment on recommended improvements at a public open house on Thursday, April 14.

The project team will present details of the study and accept public comments on April 14 from 3:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. at the Sunset City Hall located at 200 West 1300 North in Sunset, Utah. Comments will continue to be accepted through May 14, 2005 and will be included in the project record.

Any person or group unable to attend the public open house, but wishing to provide comments, may do so in writing.
