29.18 Policy

- 29.18.1 Realizing that some criminal activity may require major investigative efforts or may involve multiple jurisdictions, the Weber County Sheriff's Office shall be a willing participant in task forcing its available resources with other agencies in order to combat crime which affects the safety and well-being of communities in this County.
- 29.18.2 The investigative task force may consist of personnel from the various organizational components of the Weber County Sheriff's Office, or it may involve personnel from various local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies.
- 29.18.3 The investigative task force may undertake major investigative projects which are localized or which have multi-jurisdictional characteristics.
- 29.18.4 If a multi-agency task force is formed, the directors of the agencies involved shall sign a written agreement to include:
- A. The objectives and purpose of the task force.
 - B. The required personnel along with their authority and responsibilities.
 - C. Resources available to the task force.
 - D. The designation of a specific individual to be the deputy-in-charge, with full authority and responsibility for the activities of the task force.

- E. A schedule of progress/status reports to be directed to each agency director. These reports will be the basis for an ongoing evaluation of the effectiveness of the task force effort.
- F. A time schedule for the achievement of objectives and a date for the termination of the task force.

29.18.5 If a task force consists of only Weber County Sheriff's Office personnel, it will be under the control of an existing organizational unit whose commanding officer will have command of and be responsible for the activities of the task force.
