45.53 **Policy**

45.53.1 When staffing levels are sufficient to permit, and enforcement needs of the Motor Unit will allow, a motor deputy should ride with a partner when operating his/her motorcycle.

45.53.2 Code-3 Operation

- A. The Office emergency response policy applies to motor deputies with the exception of the safety restraint usage.
- B. The same will dictate a motor deputy's conduct in the event of a pursuit situation.

45.54 **Procedure**

45.54.1 Violator stops

- A. Deputy safety is the first priority.
- B. Try to stop the violator where there is sufficient room on the right edge of the roadway or solid road shoulder to avoid over-exposure to the travel lane and other traffic.
- C. Do not stop in front of the violator's vehicle. If you are forced to pass during the stop, circle back and reposition prior to dismounting the motorcycle.
- D. Dismount the motorcycle on the right side.

E. If traffic conditions, speed, visibility, or any other factors restrict the normal safety expectations of the rider, use good judgement and reconsider stopping the violator.

45.54.2 High-risk stops

- A. Assistance should be present prior to making the stop if at all possible. Understand that a motor deputy is at a definite disadvantage. An automobile unit should be present.
- B. Do not park as close to the rear of the suspect vehicle as you would on other violator stops.
- C. Park in a diagonal position as this may provide some protection.
- D. Use telephone poles, mailboxes, parked cars, etc. for additional protection.
- E. Determine if you can handle your weapon(s) with gloves on. If not, develop a technique to remove them prior to making the stop.

45.54.3 Night riding

A. Deputies riding motorcycles after dark should, when possible, pair up throughout the shift. This will increase the visibility of the motor deputies to the other drivers on the road.
