## 45.57 **Policy**

- 45.57.1 Motor deputies shall follow the dress standards in accordance with Office policy. The motor wheel pin shall be worn over the name plate, and is required on all dress for level I deputies.
- 45.57.2 Summer dress: Motor pants and boots, short sleeve tan shirts for day shift and for night shift, light-duty jacket or leather jacket.
- 45.57.3 Winter dress: Motor pants and boots, long sleeve tan shirt and tan or black turtle neck. Light-duty, heavy-duty, or leather jacket.
- 45.57.4 Motorcycle uniforms should be dry cleaned utilizing Office approved dry cleaning services and following Office procedures.

  They MUST be dry-cleaned only. (The deputy may be required to replace the uniform if he/she machine washes it and its appearance is altered.)

## 45.57.5 Class A uniform

- A. When authorized by the traffic sergeant, the following dress will be required:
  - Long sleeve tan shirt with approved turtle neck or with black braid and white ascot and white gloves. Or, short sleeve tan shirt with opposite white accessories. Motor pants and polished

boots are also required.

- B. Motor deputy automobile duty dress
  - 1. When more than half of the deputy's shift time requires the use of a vehicle other than the motorcycle, the deputy shall dress in standard issue uniform, as designated by the office uniform policy. See chapter 28.

## C. Training dress

1. Deputies participating in motor training may wear civilian clothing including pants and shirt, boots and eye protection. The boots and eye protection are mandatory. Soft-soled "casual" or "tennis" shoes are not acceptable. Boots must be of a design to lend support to the ankles.
