### **6.15.1** Purpose

To set as a guideline when to notify the Sheriff of incidents that would be noteworthy, media worthy, incidents that might deal with liability issues and those issues that significantly affect employees.

#### 6.15.2 Rationale

Due to the very work we perform in Law Enforcement, Corrections, and Emergency Management, there will be extra-ordinary criminal events, certain special events, personnel events, as well as planning efforts that may require notification to the Sheriff or other supervisory staff.

### **6.15.3** Policy

The following incidents will require notification to respective supervisors up to and including the Sheriff:

- A. Death or serious injury to any member of this office, whether on or off duty.
- B. Death or serious injury of any person when a member of the office is involved, either directly or indirectly, whether on or off duty.
- C. Any incident that involves highly visible individuals or entities such as celebrities, political figures or controversial figures.
- D. The involvement of any office member in a controversial, criminal or compromising situation, whether on or off duty.
- E. Any Search and Rescue incident that begins an assignment of SAR Personnel.

- F. Any other crime or event that you feel, because of its nature or circumstances, may justify notification of a superior. This would apply to multi-agency events of newsworthy significance.
- G. Any potential or actual civil unrest or disturbance/riot, where extraordinary means are required to restore the peace.
- H. Any pursuit involving a Sheriff's Office vehicle.
- I. Any criminal or controversial incident involving a peace officer from another jurisdiction, where the Weber County Sheriff's Office is involved in the investigation.
- J. S.A.T./S.W.A.T. call-outs and/or activations.
- K. Any event that restricts routine access to residences or businesses for an extended period of time such as, but not limited to, evacuation or quarantine.
- L. Life altering events of staff members of this office. This would include births, marriages, severe illnesses, injury, hospital stays, or death of close family members of employees.
- M. Any incident involving the use of a Tazer or discharge of a firearm, other than for animal dispatch.
- N. Any serious crimes against person (homicide, robberies, kidnapping, forcible sexual abuse, etc.) This includes unattended deaths of a suspicious nature.
